Happy September Everyone!!!

Hope you all had a great summer! We had lots of great events over the past couple of months and the fall is shaping up to be even bigger be sure to check your Sign Post and our website: srpwesterlyhoa.org for all the details.

From Berkeley Township:

Everyone should have received your new Robocans. After September 15, 2025, the township will be accepting orders for the purchase of second cans if needed. The cost for an extra can is \$65. There is a maximum of two (2) trash cans and two (2) recycling cans per household.

Please begin utilizing the new trash (BURGUNDY) can and recycling (BLUE) can only after your old cans have been emptied. To discard your old cans, please leave them at the curb once you receive your new cans. They will be collected separately within a few days.

TRASH should be securely bagged and placed in the BURGUNDY can. RECYCLING items must

be placed loose (NO PLASTIC BAGS) in the BLUE can; cardboard must be flattened and placed in the recycling can.

Residents with disabilities: Please provide a doctor's note stating you are disabled to be added to our list for special assistance. A staff member will retrieve your can from the top of your driveway and return it after being emptied. For more information about this program, please contact Public Works at: 732-349-4616.

BULK TRASH: Residents will continue receiving unlimited bulk trash collections throughout the year but must first call 732-349-4616 to schedule the pickup.



Per page 75 of the Medicare & You 2025 Handbook: "All plans with the same letter (F, G, N) offer the same basic benefits, no matter where you live or which insurance company you buy the policy from." 

Silver Ridge Park Westerly Homeowners Association UPDATED 2025 Pool Rules and Regulations

- All homeowners in good standing as defined by the Bylaws and NJ Administrative Code must be current with dues, assessment or liens. Guests must acquire a pool badge from the pool monitor upon entering the pool.
- All homeowners must show their blue homeowners badge upon entering the pool area to the monitor on duty. Every resident living in a unit that was listed at certification received a badge. If a badge is misplaced or lost, homeowners are required to purchase a new one before the opening of the pool season. The cost is \$18.00 per badge, per homeowner.
- Every home may bring 1 guest free of charge to the pool, however, up to 5 additional guests may accompany a homeowner at a charge of \$5.00 per guest per day or \$15.00 per guest for a season pass. *One free guest per household.*
- Guests will be required to sign in. Additional passes are only to be sold to Silver Ridge Park Westerly homeowners in good standing, not residents of neighboring communities.
- There is **absolutely no** saving of tables, chairs, or lounge chairs.
- Guests under 16 years of age are permitted to use the pool from 10:00 am till 1:00 pm. All under the age of 16 must leave the pool area by 1:15 pm. All under the age of 16 must be accompanied by an adult responsible for their safety and conduct. There will be **no** charge for children 16 years of age under to attend the pool.
- Children under 3 years of age are **not** permitted in the pool area. Children must be toilet trained to use the pool.
- Adult, child, and swim diapers are **not** permitted in the pool at any time.
- Individuals with signs or symptoms of infectious or contagious disease, cold, nasal discharge, cuts, bandages, skin eruptions, or other infections are prohibited from using the pool.
- It is suggested that hair longer than shoulder length be tied as a ponytail. Water shoes are permitted, however, they are not to be worn to the pool, but changed upon entering the water. Streetwear is **not** permitted in the pool. Shirts designated for swimming are permitted.
- Food is permitted poolside. It is required that all residents clean up after themselves. No alcohol or glass containers of any kind are permitted poolside.
- Running or rough and rowdy playing is not permitted in the pool area. Rafts, footballs, and toy surfboards are **prohibited**. Arm floats, noodles, noodle chairs and belts are allowed. Beach balls can be used for tossing around and/or volleyball by adults as long as the pool is not crowded and residents in the pool are asked first.
- Diving and jumping of any kind is **not** permitted.
- No animals are permitted on the pool property.
- Wet bathing suits are **NOT** permitted in the clubhouse/kitchen. Please use footwear when entering restrooms, clubhouse, and kitchen areas.
- Smoking and vaping are permitted only outside of the pool area in designated smoking areas.
- The pool committee members, designated pool monitors and the board of trustees are the final authority on

questions and interpretation of the listed regulations. This includes questions concerning decorum conduct and admissions.

- The Board of Trustees reserves the right to close the pool area for club events.
- Failure to abide by the above rules may result in the forfeiture of your pool access for a period of time to be determined by the Board of Trustees.
- Pool hours are from 10:00 AM- 8:00 PM. The pool is open for any homeowner who wishes to do morning swimming laps only at 9:00 AM, however, a second person must be present at the pool. There is NO swimming unattended.
- There is no swimming after 8:00 PM unless of a function that has been approved by the Board of Trustees.
- The Board of Trustees revised these rules and regulations on March 18, 2025. 2nd Revision 3/24/2025 3rd Revision 3/26/2025, 4th Revision 5/13/2025
- The above rules and regulations are effective as of 1st day of pool opening in the 2025 season. Approved by SRPWesterly Board of Trustees



Once installed, your tree becomes the property of the SRP Westerly HOA. Sign, date & return this form with your sketch to the Trustee mailbox in the Clubhouse. Do not plant your tree until you have the final written approval from the HOA. It is recommended you speak with any neighbors about the plan installation of your tree. The turn-around time to review and approve or deny your request could take up to 30 days from the date of your submission so your patience is appreciated.

In keeping with Berkeley Township shed ordinance, homeowners are permitted, effective immediately, to install one (1) shed on their property, up to and including 64 square feet. (8' x 8' x 8')


Modification of existing shed policy 11th in the architectural Rules and Regulations was voted for, approved and has changed to:

- 1. Sheds may not be placed anywhere other than the rear of the home.
- All sheds must remain within the sidelines of the home.
- Sheds may NOT be installed on common ground property.
- 4. Said shed shall be of any structure material the homeowner desires.
- 5. Sheds that are required to be fastened must be on a firm ground structure. DO NOT place any shed on a cement slab. Cement slabs add square feet to your taxable living space and will be taxed by Berkeley Township.
- 6. In accordance with Berkeley Township ordinance, sheds must be placed at least three feet from the back of the property line.
- 7. Although Berkeley Township requires only a 3 foot side setback, SRP Westerly requires all shed placement to remain within the sidelines of the home.
- 8. In accordance with Berkeley Township ordinance, electrical wiring of sheds is not permitted.

9. If a homeowner chooses to install a shed against their home, it may not block any windows or doors. 10. Homeowners MUST submit an architectural approval

request form along with a drawing showing the location of the proposed shed to the SR Westerly Architectural Committee. (Architectural forms are available in your monthly copy of the Sign Post).

11. The homeowner must submit a zoning permit application, required fees and forms to the Berkeley Township Town Hall /Zoning Office. (Zoning Permit Application forms can be obtained from the Berkeley Township website or the Zoning Office.)



Close your eyes and picture the first flowers of Spring that quickly melt away the cold of Winter. If you want to enjoy that wonderful feeling in your yard next March, you have to get organized right now in September. Purchase your Spring bulbs now so you can get the best choice of varieties. Ordering from the internet will offer you the most diversity of bulbs; but our local 'big box' stores will have a decent selection if you shop this month. Do not wait until October!

Bulbs that flower in the Spring need the Winter season as 'chill time' to grow roots and energize themselves. Spring flowering bulbs are almost foolproof and return year-after-year. When you get your bulbs, you can plant them immediately or store them in a paper bag in your refrigerator where the 40-degree temperature and darkness will mimic underground Winter conditions. Schedule to plant your bulbs no later than Thanksgiving.

Living here in Silver Ridge Park- Westerly we are fortunate that planting bulbs is easy because our houses were built on an ancient ocean floor of sand.

Three species of Spring bulbs for your yard that are deer resistant are: (1) **Daffodils** (Narcissus species) -one of the best known 'Spring flowers' with hundreds of varieties to choose from in shades of yellow, white, pink & orange. (2) **Ornamental Onions** (Allium species) -attractive flowering plants that have a trademark ball-shaped flower cluster that blooms on stalks growing from 1' to 5' tall. (3) **Snowdrops** (Galanthus nivalis) -one of the very first flowers to emerge and sometimes will even poke through a light coating of snow.



If you prefer Tulips, Crocus or Hyacinths they need to be 'fenced in' as they are quickly eaten by deer. Plant all your Spring-blooming bulbs nearby any entrance to your house where you can cheer on their daily progress next March thru May!
