

PRESIDENT MESSAGE

Bobbi reminded everyone to act cordially and to please wait until the meeting is open for questions at the end. She also gave a heartfelt welcome to all attending and reminded of the 3 minute limit to questions. President Duckers also stated that the board are all volunteers and are doing the best they can. She also gave a thank you to Michele Hamilton, MaryEllen Geanaris, and Debi Zarro for maintaining hospitality duties at each HOA meeting. Also mentioned was our HOA Holiday Party for all residents in good standing would be on December 18th. More info to follow.

President Duckers asked residents for a wish list from residents of what the community wants and needs. Also President Duckers asked for volunteers for various committees. Ex: By-Laws & Budget.

President Duckers welcomed any new homeowners in attendance.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Board members had read and were asked if any corrections needed to be made to September minutes. A motion was taken to accept the September 2025 minutes. 1st –Karen, 2nd – Joe. All in favor unanimously - minutes approved. Kathy Hopkins stated that minutes are posted on our website, in the Signpost and DRAFTS are in the conference room, Bulletin Board across from the office, and in the lobby in the glass HOA display. Each meeting they are approving the previous month's meeting.

Kathy Hopkins also announced that there would be a Veterans luncheon on 10/18 and presented a copy of the flyer to the community. (This will be at Holiday City South Clubhouse)Also presented were flyers for a free Thanksgiving dinner for those who wanted or needed one. Meals for dine in needed reservations. Also Pick up and delivery were available.

THE TREASURERS REPORT

Betty O'Brien read the report. The treasurer's report is posted in the Signpost and on our website. A motion to accept the report, 1st – Kathy Hopkins, 2nd – Diana Dillon All in favor unanimously - Financial Report approved.

ARCHITECTURAL

Henny Warmenhoven stated nothing to report.

COMMON GROUND

Henny Warmenhoven reminded everyone once again. that, you or your lawn services are NOT to place leaves, branches, garbage or any debris in the COMMON AREA. No problem with trees due to the recent storm.

Henny then reported that the state land behind Whitmore Drive will not be taken care of and there will now be NO REIMBURSEMENT for the trees our HOA has paid to have removed thus far as told to us. The township is now saying it is not state land. Henny stated state land is paid for in taxes and we as a community should not have to pay again. A letter will be composed and handed out to residents affected to mail to Senator D'Amato immediately so he and his office know we are concerned.

Henny also stated all complaints filled out on form (in the Signpost) are anonymous and can be dropped off in the office or the Trustee mailbox in the lobby.

THE POOL

Henny Warmenhoven gave a report for Bill. In one of the corners, dirt leaches and runs onto pool area concrete. He met with Smitty and something will be proposed to prevent this.

We are waiting for a proposal for some new tables and all umbrellas. If all works out we can put 50% down and

As you deck the halls this holiday season, be fire smart. A small fire that spreads to a Christmas tree can grow large very quickly.



PICKING THE TREE

Choose a tree with fresh, green needles that do not fall off when touched.



PLACING THE TREE

- Before placing the tree in the stand, cut 2" from the base of the trunk.
- Make sure the tree is at least three feet away from any heat source, like fireplaces, radiators, candles, heat vents or lights.
- Make sure the tree is not blocking an exit.
- Add water to the tree stand. Be sure to add water daily.



LIGHTING THE TREE

- Use lights that are listed by a qualified testing laboratory. Some lights are only for indoor or outdoor use.
- Replace any string of lights with worn or broken cords or loose bulb connections. Read manufacturer's instructions for number of light strands to connect.
- Never use lit candles to decorate the tree.
- Always turn off Christmas tree lights before leaving home or going to bed.



Get rid of the tree after Christmas or when it is dry. Dried-out trees are a fire danger and should not be left in the home or garage, or placed outside against the home.

Check with your local community to find a recycling program.

Bring outdoor electrical lights inside after the holidays to prevent hazards and make them last longer.

FACTS

- (!) Almost one third of home Christmas tree fires are caused by electrical problems.
- (!) Although Christmas tree fires are not common, when they do occur, they are more likely to be serious.
- (!) A heat source too close to the tree causes more than one in every five of the fires.

In keeping with Berkeley Township shed ordinance, homeowners are permitted, effective immediately, to install one (1) shed on their property, up to and including 64 square feet. (8' x 8' x 8')


Modification of existing shed policy 11th in the architectural Rules and Regulations was voted for, approved and has changed to:

- 1. Sheds may not be placed anywhere other than the rear of the home.
- All sheds must remain within the sidelines of the home.
- Sheds may NOT be installed on common ground property.
- 4. Said shed shall be of any structure material the homeowner desires.
- 5. Sheds that are required to be fastened must be on a firm ground structure. DO NOT place any shed on a cement slab. Cement slabs add square feet to your taxable living space and will be taxed by Berkeley Township.
- 6. In accordance with Berkeley Township ordinance, sheds must be placed at least three feet from the back of the property line.
- 7. Although Berkeley Township requires only a 3 foot side setback, SRP Westerly requires all shed placement to remain within the sidelines of the home.
- 8. In accordance with Berkeley Township ordinance, electrical wiring of sheds is not permitted.

9. If a homeowner chooses to install a shed against their home, it may not block any windows or doors. 10. Homeowners MUST submit an architectural approval

request form along with a drawing showing the location of the proposed shed to the SR Westerly Architectural Committee. (Architectural forms are available in your monthly copy of the Sign Post).

11. The homeowner must submit a zoning permit application, required fees and forms to the Berkeley Township Town Hall /Zoning Office. (Zoning Permit Application forms can be obtained from the Berkeley Township website or the Zoning Office.)
